


Dulmy Norely is not in school at this time because the child is still too young. She helps at home by being good. She likes to play with dolls. She is in satisfactory health.





Nazareth lives with his parents and two sisters. His parents struggle to provide for the family.

Nazareth is growing up in a humid, mountainous region of northeastern Guatemala that's been affected by prolonged drought in recent years. It's one of the poorest areas in Guatemala, with more than eight in 10 people living in poverty. Families rely on agriculture for food and income, but soil erosion and poor land management make it difficult for them to grow enough to provide for their families. Children and families don't have access to clean water, which contributes to poor health, and many kids are malnourished. Because of widespread poverty, children often must work to help make ends meet instead of attending school, and schools are under-resourced for students' needs. The majority of people who live here are Indigenous people groups, but historic discrimination toward them means they're widely excluded from resources that could empower them to lift themselves out of poverty.






